RESEARCH MILESTONE (YEAR 2006)

MAAP goes Regional (HEIs in Region III) & National (Maritime HEIs) for possible Global Collaborative project

The third MAAP Journal to be issued shall contain papers that were presented and published in national and international conferences in the AY 2004- 2005.

On January 2006, the AUNP project ended. The paper ["The Impact of the AUNP Project on the Human Resource Development In MAAP: Recent Philippine MET System Innovations"](#) shows that indeed, the AUNP project paved way for a continuous relevant and responsive research cooperation and linkage with other maritime schools globally, towards a better Maritime Education and Training in the Asia Pacific and beyond!

On April 3-4, 2006, in support to the request by the Lyceum International Maritime Academy (LIMA) in Batangas Philippines (Ref: request letter by LIMA officials for speakers from the pool of MAAP experts), MAAP sent two resource speakers (Dr. Angelica M. Baylon and C/M Jesus Ricon) to conduct and facilitate a seminar–workshop on Instructional Materials Writing and Content-Based Teaching. Two papers were prepared for the said assignments: ["PBL: A Global Innovative Trend in Teaching Maritime for an Effective and Efficient Philippine MET System"](#) and ["Getting Started in PBL At Lyceum International Maritime Academy \(LIMA\): Innovations in Philippine MET System."](#)

On April 27-28, 2006, MAAP in collaboration with the Philippine Association of Extension Program Implementers (PAEPI), hosted the First National (Maritime Schools) and Regional Consultative Forum and Training – Workshop on Research and Extension Services with the theme "Strengthening Research and Extension Services Towards Global Competitiveness" The programme of activities involved resource speakers, facilitators and moderators from PAEPI and various project partners (REDTI, AVE and CHRE), that aimed to inform, educate, train and organize the interested participants to link and network for possible collaborative projects among HEIs based on common interest and concerns. This 2-day activity received endorsement from CHEDRO III Director Dr. Felizardo Y. Francisco for active participation of HEIs in Region III and CHED Chairman Dr. Carlito S. Puno for the support of Maritime schools. Dr. Baylon delivered the opening address followed by the welcome messages by VP Felix M. Oca on behalf of MAAP President who was in London for official business, and two distinguished guests Hon Mayor Angel Peliglorio, Jr and CHEDRO III Director IV Dr . Felizardo Y. Francisco CESO IV.

Dr. Ester V. Tucay, the Chairperson of PAEPI introduced the participants and guests and provided a summary of the participating institutions from participant's directory. Sixty (60) participants inclusive of the 3 staffs of MAAP, represented 37 various HEIS and 5 various Institutions (PN, CHRE, AVE, Philcamsat and TESDA) in the Philippines. There were 10 HEIS from Region III (MAAP Bataan, SDJC Nueva Ecija , BSU Bulacan, RMTU Zambales, ECC Pampanga, BPSC Bataan, URC Bulacan, CC Olongapo, TDEL Bataan and BASC Bataan) , 17 Maritime HEIS (MAAP Bataan, JBLC Iloilo, UI Iloilo, ISCOF Iloilo, WVSTC Iloilo, VMA Bacolod, MPC Naga, MPC Legaspi, AIMS Manila, TIP Manila, TIP QC, PMI Manila , CU Cagayan De Oro, HCDC Davao, LB-LIMA Batangas , PIT Leyte, AFCP Davao and PSA Antique) and 10 HEIS (MSU Marawi, UNP Vigan,, USM Cotobato , SKSC Sultan Kudarat, CSU Capiz, NVSU Nueva Viscaya, PSU Camarines Sur, URC Morong Rizal , PNU Manila and TUP Manila) representing various regions (NCR, Reg I, II, III, IV, V , VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI , XII and ARMM) that composed the 37 HEIS.

After the conduct of the National Forum and Training on Research and Extension services, the following forum outputs are noted:

1. Increase Membership of PAEPI, AVE and REDTI

Thirty-five new members of PAEPI, AVE and REDTI coming from various regions

2. Election and Induction of Region III Officers and Members

The pioneer set of officers in the Region III from 10 committed HEIs

3. Action Plan for Region III

In reference to the PAEPI BOD Region III Strategic Plan for Education, Research and Extension Services, the PAEPI officers came up with a PAEPI Officers Action Plan for Region III. The PAEPI officers/ REDTI members shall be submitting their accomplishment report to PAEPI-BOD Region III /elected Region III REDTI President -Dr. Baylon of MAAP, who shall be reporting the same to the Regional Advisers, REDTI BOD Dr. Luzaminda Ramirez of RMTU, National PAEPI Board and CHEDRO III Director. The PAEPI-BOD Region III may recommend good projects in the region for funding & recommend awardees for the best PAEPI / REDTI extension/ research implementers in Region III.

4. Collaborative Research and Extension Services Project Proposal in Region III (Regional) with BSU as project leader

Region III composed of 10 HEIs came up with a research and extension services project on "Portability of Water in Selected Areas in Region III: Basis for Policy Decision-Making." This project is led by the Bulacan State University with other 9 HEIs namely: MAAP, CC, BASC, TDEL, RMTU, BPSC, ECC, BASC and GJSC. This project starts in June 2006 and ends in June 2007.

5. Collaborative Project among 16 Maritime Schools in the Philippines (National) with MAAP as project leader

The 17 maritime HEIs had listened to the AUNP project presentation of Dr. Baylon as well as the PBL in MET as a global innovative trend in teaching MET. The group came up with a consensus on coming up with a collaborative project on PBL in MET to be led by MAAP based on the paper provided by Dr. Baylon. Those who are interested should email their respective proposed ideas to be incorporated on the proposal. Twenty maritime representatives have signed interest and their inputs shall be incorporated in the finalization of the project proposals.

6. Identification of HEIs for annual MAAP exchange of publications

Forty-two (42) Institutions received a complimentary copy of the MAAP Journal for its widest information dissemination and for exchange Publications.

On May 24- 26, 2006, through the invitation of Research and Educational Development and Training Institute (REDTI), MAAP presented a paper "An Overview on the Research Endeavors in MAAP: A Framework for MET Innovations" that highlights the different research initiatives and endeavors initiated by MAAP from year 2000 to year 2006 held in Davao City, Philippines during a National Forum on Research
