As of **April 11, 2016** letter from PCCIERD to MAAP President , informing that the project submitted by Dr Angelica Baylon was not endorsed for approval for two reasons : Only 2 of the 10DRRM proposals has qualified under the program and that Chemical /Industrial Hazards risk reduction and management is not a priority of DOST at this time . With an advise from PCCIERD Executive Director Dr. Carlos Primo C Davis that should we wish to pursue the research with collaborators form Japan and other countries, using own funding and resources , to please feel free to process and appreciated the effort to pursue a research initiative with DOST, another version of the proposal was submitted to IAMU


As of **June 30 , 2016 deadline , Dr. Baylon** submitted to International Association of maritime Universities or IAMU , the NATECH project proposal to be accomplished by MAAP in partnership from both IAMU members and Non IAMU members, however , not considered for funding as only 4 have been approved out of 45 submitted proposals by IAMU members institutions (78)

As an update , NATECH experts from Japan ( Kyoto University and Osaka University ) who received funding in Japan , will visit MAAP on Feb 27 to March 5 to meet with Bataan stakeholders of industrial estates in Bataan and invited Dr Baylon in Japan for the 3<sup>rd</sup> NATECH training and Symposium on **March 13-14, 2017** , sponsored by Kyoto University , for the realization of the NATECH partnership with Bataan province as a model. (Ref: invitation letter from Kyoto University dated Feb 3, 2017 and email coordination from December 2016 to Jan /Feb 2017). Dr. Baylon is invited by Kyoto University to train in NATECH tools and attend the 3<sup>rd</sup> NATECH Symposium on **March 5-22, 2017** with Kyoto University and Osaka University as sponsors (airfare , accommodations, training and registration fees etc)

2. Submitted to NRCP two proposals namely NATECH project and GECAMET project. As only one project may be approved at a time, - “*Gender Equality and Cultural Awareness in Philippines Maritime Education and Training “or GECAPMET* “– was presented and was approved subject to minor revisions per comments by NRCP reviewers ( Ref : Email dated Oct 4, 2016 9:58 am subject GECAPMET and the letter from NRCP Executive Director Dr. Marietta Sumagaysay dated **Sept 29, 2016** ). The updated version will be submitted on **Feb 20, 2017** during the NRCP organizational meeting hosted by DLSU, Manila.
